

## APPENDIX II-S: UPGRADES TO CLASSROOM SPACES SINCE 1997-98

In addition to building improvements made with capital and maintenance funds, the University administration funds annual general assignment classroom upgrades. In recent years, renovation funds have been extended to upgrading departmental classrooms in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS) as well. Below is a summary of upgrades to room quality over the past ten years.

### Auditoria Renovation Program

Rooms seating 100 or more have received special attention over the past decade to provide greatly improved teaching and learning space. All such rooms except CB 225 are new or have had significant work such as upgraded lighting, seating, carpet, and electrical or heating and cooling systems.

- BBE 101: a new 160-seat auditorium added to the classroom pool
- BCSE 101: new seating and carpet, new lighting and light controls at room front, new instructor writing surface (2001, 2003)
- EPB 107: new seating, new flooring, paint (2007)
- MH Auditorium: completely remodeled (1998) for new seating, flooring, lighting, acoustics, better sight lines, and fixed technology; flooring repairs (2004)
- PH 100: completely remodeled (2001) for new seating and carpet; new heating, cooling and ventilation; new lighting; corrected problems in acoustics; added disability access
- PBE W10: new seating and carpet (2000)
- PBE W151: new seating and carpet (2000)
- PC C20: a new 400-seat auditorium added to the classroom pool in 2005
- SC 1505: new 157-seat auditorium added to the classroom pool in 2000; improved lighting on the instructor's writing surface (2003)
- Shambaugh Auditorium (LIB): new seating (2000); new electrical system; new, programmable lighting (2003)
- TH 125: replaced seating, new flooring (2005)
- VAN LR1: new lighting and controls, new video screen that can display two images side by side (2005)
- VAN LR2: new lighting and controls, new video screen that can display two images side by side (2005); new writing surface (2006); new seating (2007)

### Upgrades to General Assignment Classrooms

Some projects have made improvements across multiple buildings:

- A GPS clock system was installed in all general assignment classrooms, to provide accurate time in every room;
- New light switching was added to 74 rooms, to permit the front of the room to be lit differently than the rear;
- Vision panels were added to classroom doors where not already present (2006);
- 57 instructor tables, aged 30-40 years, were replaced with safer, modern tables.
